Carolyn Dufurrena Literary Arts: Poetry



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Carolyn Dufurrena is a rancher, writer, film-maker and award-winning journalist. In 2018 her appearances included three- and four-day writing workshops for up to 100 elementary students, and weekend intensive workshops to prepare students to recite at the Elko Cowboy Poetry Gathering. A retired educator, she has presented workshops for teachers and served as poet-in-residence in several Nevada high schools for Nevada Arts Council's *Powering Up Poetry: Highway 50 Road Trip.* She regularly shares her poems and stories at Elko's National Cowboy Poetry Gathering and has appeared at festivals in Oregon and California.

Carolyn's most recent book, *Quiet, Except for the Wind: Poems and Stories from the Cold Desert,* was a finalist in Poetry for Women Writing the West in 2017 and the 2018 Will Rogers Medallion Award. She writes regularly for *Range Magazine* and has been awarded Outstanding Journalist for Magazines by the Nevada Press Association. Carolyn is the author of *Fifty Miles from Home: Riding the Long Circle on a Nevada Family Ranch* and a collection of essays in *Sharing Fencelines: Three Friends Write from Nevada's Sagebrush Corner*.
